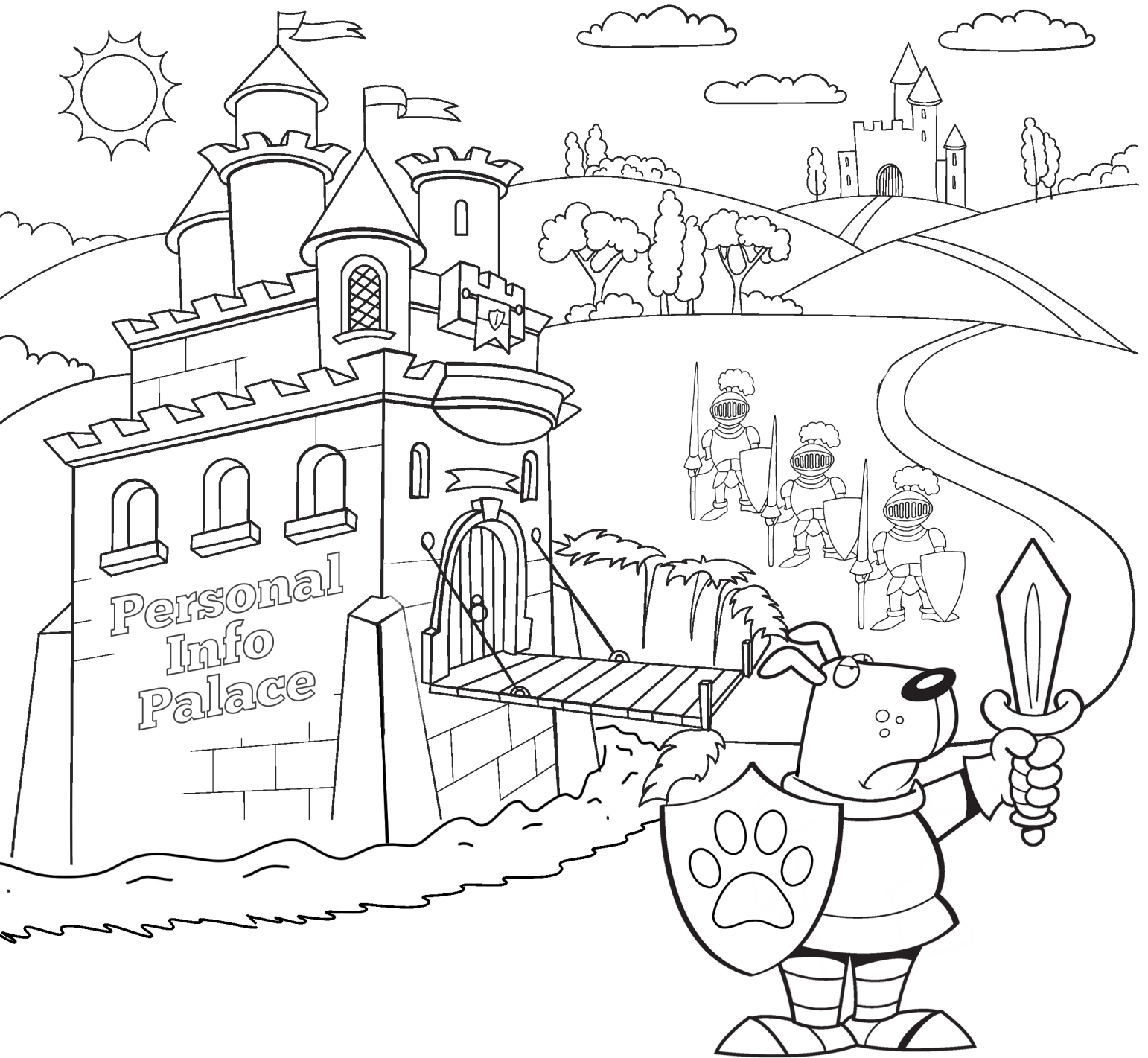

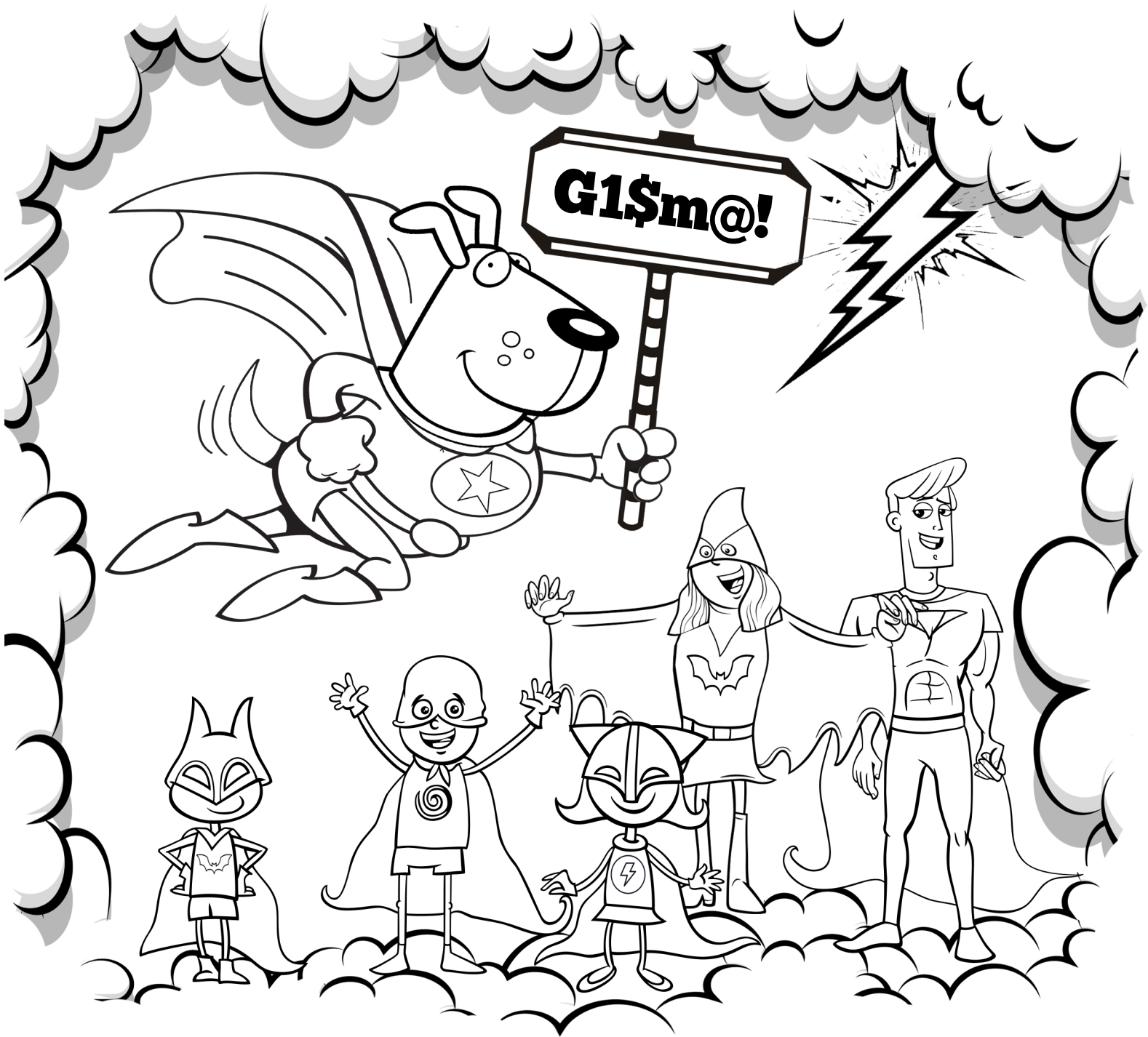

Guard Your Personal Info



Never share your full name, home address, school, or phone number online without asking a trusted adult.

Strong Passwords are Superpowers



Use strong passwords with letters, numbers, and symbols and never share them with others except with trusted adults.

Ask Before You Click



Always ask a grown-up before clicking on links or downloading anything from the internet. Some links or downloads can lead to harmful sites or install viruses.

Be Kind Online



You would not bully someone in the real world.
Do not bully someone in the digital world. Be kind,
supportive and respectful online. Treat others the
way you want them to treat you.

Keep Your Location Private



Turn off location sharing on your apps and games to stay safe. Sharing your location can tell strangers where you are, and it's better to keep that information private.

Beware of Strangers Online



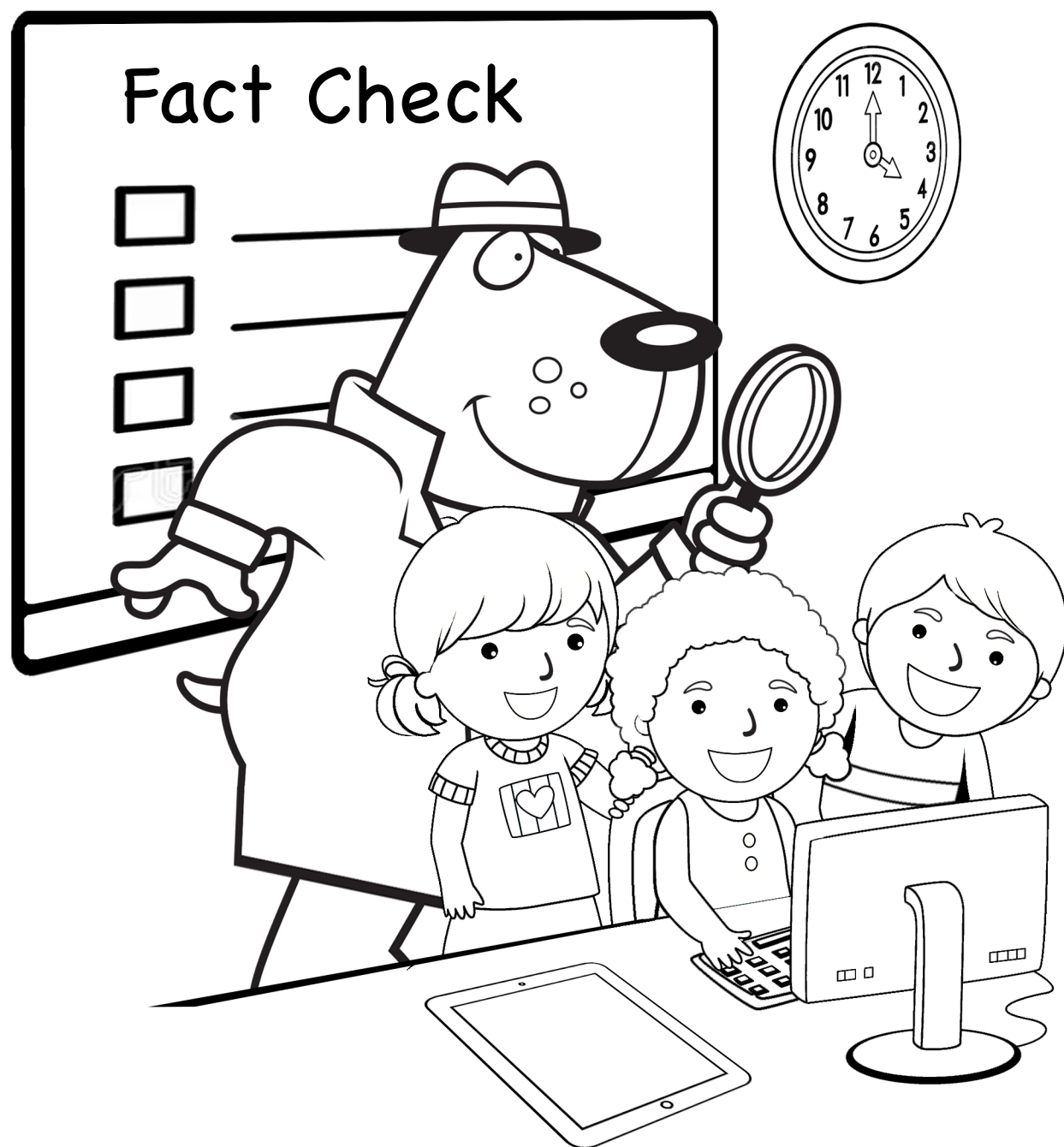
You wouldn't talk to strangers in real life. So, don't talk to strangers online without a parent or guardian's permission. Even when you are playing games!

Report When Something Feels Wrong



If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, tell a trusted adult right away. You can report anything suspicious or uncomfortable, like mean messages or scary content, to an adult you trust.

Not Everything Online is True



Double-check facts and don't believe everything on the internet. Not all information online is accurate. Ask a trusted adult for help if unsure.
